I didn't come up with the phrase nor can I recall who did, but I am fascinated with end-beginnings. Our lives are so filled with such times – some pleasantly so, others, not so much. For example, those of you with children will recognize that at the birth of your first child you faced the end of your ability to go do whatever, whenever (including sleep!) and began an exciting new life as a parent. At the same time, the death of a loved one leads us through an equally, though different, transitional end-beginning.

When Mary Magdalene and the other Mary arrived at the tomb, they encountered a strange sight. The stone had been rolled away and an angel with a face lit like lightening with snowy white clothes was sitting on top of it. The guards, frightened by what had led to the open tomb, were "like dead men." As the women arrived, the angel assured them Jesus had risen from the dead, as promised and was going ahead of them to meet the disciples in Galilee. They confirmed that the tomb was empty and hurried away to tell Peter and the boys. En route, Jesus himself met them and greeted them; he then gave them the same message to relay to the disciples.

It's an incredible – almost unbelievable – end-beginning. In fact, the guards, once they came to their senses, returned to the chief priests and were paid to report that Jesus' disciples had come and stolen the body. In a society based on honor and shame, it must have been some payment for them to willingly report that such a thing had happened on their watch! But, they did, and the report spread throughout all Judea.

But Jesus had told his followers what to expect, even if they didn't understand it until Easter morning. They recalled the predictions he had shared with them as they made their way to Jerusalem. They had witnessed his arrest, saw him crucified on the cross, and watched as he was buried in the tomb, sealed by a large stone. And they stood in front of the resurrected Christ...again, as promised.

The resurrection of Jesus is such a central part of our faith as followers of Christ. It brings us this understanding that even death cannot separate us from God. It is an end-beginning we celebrate with high fanfare – Sunrise services to mark the first glimpse of the empty tomb, followed by multiple worship services where we sing our alleluia's, flower the cross, and dress again in white. Children of all ages, awake With excitement and scramble to find multi-colored eggs after emptying the loot filling the baskets left for them by the "Easter Bunny."

My guess is, by Tuesday or Wednesday, we've recovered from all the celebrations and gatherings packed into Easter day. And, generally, don't give much thought to what we have celebrated but focus instead on getting through the rest of the week or beginning our planning for Mother's Day and graduation and Memorial Day and the start of summer and...

I invite you to take some time with this upcoming end-beginning we call Easter. You see, not much about our faith makes sense without the empty tomb and the appearance of the risen Christ. It colors our understanding of everything Jesus revealed to us about God. We don't approach Christmas and the birth of the Christ-child without knowing what happens on Good Friday and Easter Sunday. We read the opening verses of any of the four gospel accounts already knowing the ending. And, we see how that ending gave way to a new beginning for all of us...even these 2,000+ years later.

End-beginnings are a lot like mini-resurrections...an old way of being and living gives way to a new way of being and living. And SO We trust. We have not been orphaned. Christ is risen and we have nothing to fear. There is indeed nothing that will separate us from God's love. May the hope and joy of Easter morning guide you through each of your end-beginnings to come.

And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age (Matthew 28:20, NIV).

I read a devotional that really touched my heart and I want to share with you all ...Have you ever faced a tough circumstance and wondered, *God, where are You?* That was the situation with many of Jesus' followers after He was crucified and buried. Their hopes and dreams were sealed in the darkened tomb, and they didn't know where to turn.

The same day that Peter and John discovered the empty tomb, two other the disciples were walking to the village of Emmaus, seven miles from Jerusalem. While discussing the tragic events of the past weekend, another man appeared and began to walk alongside them.

"What are you talking about?" the man asked. "Are you the only visitor in Jerusalem who doesn't know about the things that happened over the past few days? "What things?" the man asked.

Then the two disciples gave the **traveler, this "stranger"** a blow-by-blow account of Jesus' arrest, crucifixion, burial, and disappearance from the tomb. As they talked, their eyes were blinded by despair, and they didn't realize that hope was walking right alongside them. All they saw was the tragedy, but they missed seeing Jesus walking on the dusty road with them.

When they reached the village where they were going, they urged this "stranger" to join them for dinner. When He was at the table, Jesus assumed the role of host. He took the bread, gave thanks, broke the bread, and passed it to the men. At that point, I am sure a flood of memories returned to the men...memories of another meal where Jesus broke bread with His followers.

But perhaps what opened their eyes to this man's true identity were the nail-scarred hands that held the bread. "Their eyes were opened and they recognized him, and he disappeared from their sight" (Luke 24:31 NIV).

Perhaps you've traveled down your own dusty road to Emmaus with circumstances leaving you confused, troubled, and depressed. If so, remember this friend: just because you cannot see Jesus or sense His presence does not mean that He is not there.

He is walking the path with you. Jesus assured us with these words: "Never will I leave you; never will I forsake you" (Hebrews 13:3 NIV). "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age" (Matthew 28:20 NIV).
