

You are a Sanctuary!



A sanctuary ...well, prior to my Walk to Emmaus, I had never given much thought to what a sanctuary even was! According to Webster, it is “a place of refuge or safety; or a nature reserve”. However, according to the Bible, a sanctuary is a “consecrated place, such as:1.) the ancient Hebrew temple at Jerusalem or its holy of holies; 2.) the most sacred part of a religious building (such as the part of a Christian church in which the altar is placed)”.

Perhaps, you can say since we are all “*sheltered in place*” that our homes are our sanctuary. That is correct our home is a sanctuary but as I read what Paul taught in Corinthians chapter 3 ~ he shared to the local church in Corinth, that they are God's temple and that God's Spirit lives in them. It is thought that the church in Corinth likely had no building of their own, and instead they meet in smaller groups in the homes of various members. Paul's answer is to the point: God's Spirit lives in them (1 Corinthians 2:12; 6:19). To be clear, God's Spirit lives in each believer individually, but Paul shows here that in this way the Holy Spirit occupies the collected believers known as the church. Thus, they become the temple of God, even without a physical structure to meet in. As Christians often say, "the church" is *the people*, not *the building*.

So, we may not be meeting in our local sanctuary...church and we are just staying at home, please take comfort that we are a living sanctuary! Reminds me of the song we sing in Emmaus, “Sanctuary” ... ♪*Lord prepare me to be a sanctuary* . . . use this link to sing along: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=AxB9VH3cCN4>

This was one of Polly and my favorite songs to “sway to”! ☺ Although, we are not gathering in person, we have God within us “in person” and you are His sanctuary! Blessings to you all. ♡

Trusting God for the Future

Give all your worries and cares to God, for he cares about you. 1 Peter 5:7

By far the hardest of the Bible's commands for me to obey and live out are "Don't worry about anything" and "Rejoice always." It's not because I think they're wrong. I know the truth – nothing kills joy faster than worry! But we all worry, and some of us are really good at it. Some people just worry about their health; some just worry about their kids; some just worry about finances. But some of us worry about absolutely everything! If there were jobs for professional worriers, some of us could earn money – we're that good at it!

It's impossible to be joyful and full of worry at the same time – they cancel each other out.

So, if you are among the constant worriers, anxiety has you in its death grip. All that worry is choking out the joy in your life. Remember our definition of joy: **it is the settled assurance that God is in control of all the details of my life, the quiet confidence that ultimately everything is going to be all right, and the determined choice to praise God in all things.**

Our antidote to worry is trust. Trust that God is in control of all the details of our lives. Our trust leads to confidence that it will all be okay – not that everything will turn out the way I want it to, but that God is at work in the details. Trust will loosen that death grip of worry and allow joy to flow back into your life. As a friend of mine said, "When you're worrying, you're not trusting, and when you're trusting, you're not worrying."

. . . Friends, bad things happen. This is earth, not heaven. I can't deny the reality of all that could go wrong and perhaps has already gone wrong. But as 1 Peter 5:7 says, we can throw the whole weight of our concerns upon God for we are his personal concern. We can find the peace that comes from trusting God; and when our hearts are at peace, joy returns.
