

#### Georgetown Emmaus moves to In-Person Gatherings

DeColores! We had a wonderful, spirit filled "in-person" Emmaus Gathering on July 18<sup>th</sup> at St John's Church. It was so AWESOME to be together...and to "HUG" each other!

It was a blessing to have our Emmaus music "in-person" ...OK, YouTube is nice... but it is much better and a blessing to have music "in-person"! Our music team led by Janet with Clint, Julie and Rev John and they were all just awesome. We sang, we swayed, we clapped and we praised our Lord just like in scripture: Psalms 105:2 NIV "Sing to him, sing praise to him; tell of all his wonderful acts." And, we did last night! Since this was our first time to gather in over 1 ½ years, I chose the scripture Matthew 18:20 "For where two or three gather in my name, there am I with them." We did not have a 4th day speaker however, just about everyone in attendance shared briefly on "What was your "closest to Christ moment or a blessing" for you during the COVID pandemic"! It was wonderful to hear the stories and to really see how God was with us all during the pandemic! Rev John led us for our service.

I also, chose the scripture from an excerpt from Robert Morris service that I had just heard. His service was on: the number one reason to go to church, to feel God's presence. Pastor Robert Morris said, now, I understand that God is everywhere. That's called His omnipresence. Then, there is His inner-presence. Inner; I-N-N-E-R. when the Holy Spirit lives within us, there is His manifest presence, which is His made-known presence, which happens when we come together, in a more powerful way than I've ever seen in my life. Here are some scriptures to support this! When God told Moses to make a tabernacle on earth, the very first one ever, this is the tabernacle of Moses. The Moses's tabernacle is before Solomon's temple. God gave Moses some instructions, and by the way, He said, "What you see in heaven, build on earth". So, just think this tabernacle and the pattern used for it... is in heaven! God said, Exodus 25:8. "And let them", that's the people: "Make Me", God: "A sanctuary; that I may dwell among them". I want a place to live on earth. And then, later down in Exodus 25:22, He says: "And there", talking about the sanctuary: "There I will meet with you, and I will speak with you", something happens when we come together, and then Jesus even confirms this in the New Testament, Matthew 18:20. "For where two or three are gathered together in My name, I am there in the midst of them;" it's His presence. I'll bet you can remember some worship services when you sensed God's presence more than you've ever sensed Him before. And, you know exactly what I'm talking about, when the whole body is coming together, and we're worshiping God, His presence is so strong.

Well, that happen at this July 18th gathering, our first "in-person" gathering. We all came together ~ the leadership team, the music team, the members of the community ~ we all came together just like in scripture we are all parts of the Body of Christ and "it took us all to come together" for spiritual harmony for our gathering and to feel His presence! Just like in scripture: 1 Corinthians 12:12-14 12 There is one body, but it has many parts. But all its many parts make up one body. It is the same with Christ. 13 We were all baptized by one Holy Spirit. And so we are formed into one body. It didn't matter whether we were Jews or Gentiles, slaves or free people. We were all given the same Spirit to drink. 14 So the body is not made up of just one part. It has many parts.

And with us coming together, again as in scripture Matthew 18:20. "For where two or three are gathered together in My name, I am there in the midst of them;" and yes, we all felt His presence.

Thank you to everyone who joined us! God is Good, all the time; and all the time, God is Good! See you all on August 15th at The First United Methodist Church MCMC Building Room 1000 at 5:30pm. Let's feel His presence again!

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

Thank you to Jackie Hammar for the many years of service as our Georgetown Emmaus Treasurer! She has done an outstanding job! Everyone at Georgetown Emmaus Community says "THANK YOU" very much to Jackie! Both, Jackie and Rev. Ann discussed a new financial system that will be in place approved by the community and starting as of July 18th Georgetown Emmaus Gathering. It was approved to move the checking account into the First UMC banking management. It will be a separate account, but FUMC will maintain balances and report to the GT community on funding, deposits, and expenditures. Our new system is:

\* Offering and/or donations collected at the gatherings will be counted by two people.

\* After the count completed, the money will be put into a sealed envelope with date, amount, and Georgetown Emmaus on the outside of the envelope

\* The money will be dropped off at the mailbox in the FUMC portico.

\* If we are at St John or Wellspring Church, we will have a FUMC Emmaus community member take the money to drop it off. Terry France has offered to do this for out July gathering.

\* Our contact person at FUMC is Chris Baker

\* Jackie anticipates to close out the current bank account to be sure all checks have cleared.


