When our pastors are interviewed by certifying boards they are often asked, "Tell us about a time when you led someone to Christ." How would you answer that question? How long has it been since you had the joy of sharing your testimony with someone who didn't know Jesus?

If you have served on an Emmaus team, you may have shared your testimony as part of a talk you have given or while sharing as a table leader or assistant leader. However, there are often opportunities in our everyday life that open the conversation to spiritual sharing. You may have worked at VBS and gotten to pray with someone who heard about Jesus for the first time that week.

Recently I realized that I spend so much time at church and in spiritual group meetings, at worship and reading and writing in my journal that I have spent less and less time among secular people where they are in their work and recreation, who have no thought about God to speak of. At a business meeting in Round Rock I got to meet people from all types of businesses and give out my card offering spiritual direction as a way to balance one's life and explore deepening one's walk with God. I was startled to meet a fellow who admitted he had never given a thought to a relationship with God. I offered to meet with him to explain what such a thing could mean in his life. He happily agreed, "I would like that." I promised to pray for him and follow up with an appointment, even if it was just over the phone. At that meeting I did run into some Christians who want to strengthen their walk with the Lord by pursuing regular spiritual direction one on one. But I am more excited about "birthing a new soul" for the Kingdom.

When have you had such a privilege? Are you prepared if you do get the opportunity? Perhaps at your next few reunion group meetings you might want to take turns developing an "elevator speech" as a testimony to someone like the fellow I befriended. Perhaps you need to pray about finding a regular occasion to be in more secular gatherings, make neighborhood friends, volunteer for service in a place where there may be such opportunities. It is time, my friends to get outside our church walls and let the mind of Christ lead us to pursue those who haven't yet met the Savior of the World. What an exciting time this can be!

Jesus' Example of Slowing Down by Lisa Rowell

Have you ever noticed that when asked—*How are you doing?*—many of us answer—*Busy*— without a second thought. I mean we don't even think about it. Busy seems to be the cultural norm in our world, even our vacations often look and feel busy.

However, from the beginning of His time in the flesh Jesus modeled for us a different norm. He showed us how to slow down and move at a different pace—even when He was an infant in Bethlehem. Think about that first encounter mentioned in Scripture. God first presented His Son to us in the flesh, lying in a manger. At rest.

The angels told the shepherds to look for that as a sign. Scripture reads in Luke 2:12: "You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." God *could* have presented His infant Son wide awake, crying, or nursing. Instead, the Lord chose to present Jesus to the world at rest.

We don't need to know why God introduced our Savior that way to appreciate this perfect example of beginning whatever God calls us to do from a place of rest.

We can release burdens and take up the yoke of Jesus instead. Being yoked with Him means moving at His pace with our steps and trusting that He knows where to go. Long after Jesus grew out of sleeping in a manger, He continued to give us the perfect example of resting and moving at the pace the Father sets. In fact, during His ministry on earth, Jesus was known for a lot of things—being in a hurry wasn't one of them.

Jesus wasn't in a hurry to start His earthly ministry. He wasn't in a hurry to wake up from His nap even when His boat encountered a storm that scared the most experienced fishermen on board. He wasn't in a hurry to get to Lazarus even when He knew that His dear friend was dying. Jesus wasn't in a hurry to keep walking to the next town even though people needed Him there.

Jesus slowed down to rest. He slowed down to spend time with His Father. He slowed down to invite His disciples to rest with Him. When Jesus felt tired, He slowed down to take a break. And sometimes, Jesus took a nap. Scripture makes a point of telling us that He did. And nowhere in scripture does it read that Jesus felt guilty about any of the times He rested. Let me say that again: nowhere in scripture does it read that Jesus felt guilty about any of the times He rested.

Want to be more like Jesus in your daily life? Slow down. Rest in and with the Father. Trust His timing, His faithfulness, His goodness, and His plans for your life, and the lives of your family. Go at His pace, not your own.

I love how the Message translation words Jeremiah 2:25: "Slow down. Take a deep breath. What's the hurry? Why wear yourself out? Just what are you after anyway?"

You can do that right now. Take a deep breath and follow Jesus' example of rest. Make the choice to approach your life and your relationships from a place, from a posture of rest. Just like Jesus. I want to leave you with a question to think about: What in your life feels so urgent that you believe you can't take the time to slow down and rest?

Ask the Lord to help you follow Jesus' example to slow down. Listen for any changes to your schedule or mindset that He might be asking you to make. Be obedient to what He reveals to you.



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
