# From our Spiritual Director, Rev. Dr. Ann Hagmann

Dear Emmaus Co-journeyers,

This is a story about extraordinary power. About power that cannot be bought for all the gold in the world. About power that is a free gift from our Creator; about power that can transform us body, soul, mind, spirit, relationships. Does it sound too good to be true? Well, it isn't!!

It is the familiar story of God coming as Emmanuel, God with us, in Jesus of Nazareth, and the Holy Spirit working in us today. Let me give you my witness and you decide.

On November 13<sup>th</sup> I found out that I need a huge spinal surgery – 5 level fusion and 3 level laminectomy. I was terrified! Would I survive surgery? Would I be able to walk again? Could I rehab with a broken off iliac crest? Would I be able to go home again? My terror increased to the nth degree on

Monday when the surgery scheduler called and scheduled me for surgery on Monday December 7<sup>th</sup>. I asked her if I could call back and cancel! I'm serious!

The terror was literally coursing thru my arteries and veins. I was looking into a tunnel w/o being able to see around the bend or to see any light. I knew I needed a group to discern God's will with me in this specific situation. I had been praying about a list of people I was considering contacting, when I realized that the Spirit had already given me a small group whom I felt would be supportive of doing it. (Please note the importance of a small group in our lives. Even though my prayer group is not an accountability group, it is a deeply spiritual connection.)

You see I have been blest for many years to be a part of the Centering Prayer group at FUMC led by our own Nancy Marsh. On Tuesday November 17<sup>th</sup> we were a small group and all 5 were agreeable to discerning what the Spirit wants for me. Using the discernment method of St. Ignatius of Loyola, we asked the simple question, "Should Ann have this surgery?" For 10 minutes we sat in silence with the answer of "yes." Then we sat in quiet for another 10 minutes with "no." Afterwards we all shared what we felt during the prayer time. Everyone was affirmational to having the surgery. One described seeing a bright light during the "yes" and then when we switched to "no" a shroud covered it. That is pretty clear!

Another sang "Wade in the Water ... wade in the water ... o children wade in the water, God's gonna trouble the water today." And you know what the Bible tells us about God troubling the water, it brings healing to those in the water. Then she said, "I know you are terrified about being alone in the hospital due to Covid, but I have to tell you that you will not be alone. Your Mother and the Communion of Saints will be with you." I asked, "Did you say my Mother?" And she answered, "Yes, your Mother and the rest of the Communion of Saints." My Mother's birthday is December 6<sup>th</sup>, the day before my surgery.

Now to be absolutely honest, I was feeling peace early in the prayer, but as it continued and then others shared afterwards, my peace moved down into my deepest roots; it moved up into my highest reaches; peace filled every part of me. The terror gone.

Today, 12 days later, no change, and there will not be. Yes, I am still looking into a dark tunnel w/o being able to see around the bend or to see any light. But that does not matter. What matters is that I know that I know that I know that God is with me - God has me in life, in death, and inbetween. Thanks be to God!! My mantra going forward is - "I can do all things thru Christ who strengthens me!" (Philippians 4:13) Amen!?!

I would be very grateful for your prayers. Rev. John Clifford will lead the December 20<sup>th</sup> Zoom gathering, and Rev Mary Powell will lead on January 17<sup>th</sup>. Beyond that, I am sure the Spirit will provide. I look forward to zooming with you in the future. God bless you and keep you. Have a wonderful Advent and Christmas season! De Colores. #### **TALK 8: CHRISTIAN ACTION**

Now in Joppa, there was a disciple whose name was Tabitha, which in Greek is Dorcas. She was devoted to good works and acts of charity (Acts 9:36).

IN FEBRUARY 1996, THE PUBLIC TELEVISION NETWORK RELEASED A TRIBUTE TO THE LATE MINNIE PEARL: HATS OFF TO MINNIE PEARL: AMERICA HONOR'S MINNIE PEARL. MANY GOOD FRIENDS GAVE TESTIMONY TO HER LOVING SPIRIT AND GENEROUS MANNER. THROUGH THE YEARS, MINNIE PEARL (SARAH OPHELIA CANNON) HAD ENCOURAGED AND ENABLED MANY YOUNG COUNTRY MUSIC ARTISTS, NOT ONLY IN THEIR CAREERS, BUT IN THEIR PERSONAL LIVES AS WELL. DURING THAT TRIBUTE, THE NETWORK AIRED A TAPE OF SARAH TALKING TO A GROUP OF YOUNG ADULT ACTORS AND SINGERS. SHE TOLD THEM THAT ONE NIGHT WHEN SHE WENT TO DO A SHOW, SHE DID NOT GIVE IT HER BEST EFFORT. AFTER ALL, THERE WERE ONLY FIFTEEN PEOPLE THERE. BUT IN THAT AUDIENCE WAS A TALENT SCOUT LOOKING FOR SOMEONE TO PLAY THE PART OF ADO ANNIE IN THE MUSICAL

OKLAHOMA. BECAUSE SHE HAD DONE A HALF-HEARTED JOB, SHE WAS NOT CHOSEN FOR THE PART. SHE LEARNED THAT NIGHT THAT WHETHER SHE PLAYED TO A PACKED HOUSE OR AN EMPTY ONE, FROM THEN ON, SHE WOULD DO HER BEST. SHE TOLD THE GROUP THAT SOMETIMES IT'S BETTER TO BE SECOND RATHER THAN FIRST. HAD SHE BEEN CHOSEN FOR THE ADO ANNIE PART, WHO KNOWS WHERE SHE WOULD HAVE ENDED UP. SHE WOULD HAVE MISSED ALL OF HER YEARS AT THE GRAND OLE OPRY AND HER APPEARANCES ON THE TELEVISION SHOW HEE HAW. THE OPPORTUNITY TO BE TALKING WITH THESE ASPIRING PERFORMERS WOULD HAVE BEEN LOST. AS IT WAS, SHE WAS ABLE TO ENTERTAIN RIGHT WHERE SHE WANTED TO BE, DOING WHAT SHE WANTED TO DO. SHE FELT BLESSED BY HER LIFE AND WHERE GOD HAD LED HER.

Minnie Pearl appeared to have a down-to-earth life in Nashville with her husband, Henry, who piloted chartered planes for country music stars. She was always gracious to others. She taught Sunday school for years, was committed to her church, and gave generously of what she had been given. She supported causes she believed in without fanfare. During rehearsals her humor cut through tension and lifted the spirits of others. Like Dorcas, Sarah Cannon was devoted to good works and acts of charity. She lived the life of a committed Christian, always humorous and genuine, simple and sincere, loving and friendly. We miss her "How-deeee! I'm just so proud to be here!" Don't you imagine that's what she said upon entering heaven?

#### VIEWING OUR ZOOM BRIDGE: LOGIN REQUIRED (REGISTER ON WHOLENESS-SERVICE.ORG)

Our Zoom Portal: You may use our website's Zoom Portal in order to join our meetings with one click. Simply log in (click the link above), and you will be directed to the page with all Zoom details. If you do not have an account, click the "register" button to create a new one. Registration takes only seconds, but give yourself time to complete it, and to reach out for support if you need.

Email instead: If you would rather receive a Zoom invitation by email, please send a request to <a href="mailto:inviteme@wholeness-service.org">inviteme@wholeness-service.org</a>. A service leader will respond by sending you a Zoom invitation directly.

Joining the meeting: Connect by clicking one of the "join" links at around 6:15 pm on the day of the meeting (NOTE DIFFERENT TIME FOR DECEMBER 20). You will be placed in our waiting room, and the meeting coordinator will admit you.

Using Zoom in our meetings: At first your Zoom window may not fill your whole screen. Click on the Square at the top right of the Zoom window to expand it. Your microphone will be muted, as you may see by the microphone image in the bottom left. You may unmute by pressing the space bar when you wish to share. The stage manager will switch from a gallery view with all participants showing to another view for presentations, but you are in full control of your individual experience, and may change it at any time. Recordings: Screen capture recordings of some segments of the service will take place. Prayers, meditations, candle lighting, intercessory litanies – all of these will be recorded for use in virtual service videos after the meetings. Please be assured that personal concerns and congregational sharing will NOT be recorded or shared publicly except with the consent of all person(s) involved.

Support: If you have problems with your computer or with joining the Zoom bridge, you may call Bill Marsh at 512-635-0035. You may also wish to watch a brief tutorial on <a href="wholeness-service.org">wholeness-service.org</a> about joining a Zoom meeting.


