The Georgetown Ecumenical Wholeness Service continues in-person services in 2022-2023, with its fourth service gathering on Dec 11, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. This year, we celebrate a season of Beatitudes with monthly speakers from the pastoral community of our Williamson County partner churches. December's talk will be given by our own Rev. Mary Powell. We will meet at San Gabriel Presbyterian Church, 5404 Williams Drive, Georgetown Texas. All services are open to the public.

The theme for December is from Matthew 5:8 that says, "Blessed are the virtuous for they shall see God." We know that Jesus wouldn't make such a promise and not fulfill it. But what does it mean and how do we become so? Few are familiar with the seven, heavenly virtues that serve as counterparts to the seven deadly sins. It's important to know about these virtues, or good habits, so you can answer the call to personal holiness ... We will pray together by combining two very special types of worship services: the Service of Healing and Wholeness and Taizé Common Prayers. Communion is offered to all in attendance, with pre-packaged and gluten-free elements available.

IN THE MIDST OF OUR DARK WORLD

I keep expecting loud and impressive events to convince me and others of God's saving power. Our temptation is to be distracted by them. When I have no eyes for the small signs of God's presence – the smile of a baby, the carefree play of children, the words of encouragement and gestures of love offered by friends – I will always remain tempted to despair.

The small child of Bethlehem, the unknown man of Nazareth, the rejected preacher, the naked man on the cross, *he* asks for my full attention. The work of our salvation takes place in the midst of a world that continues to shout, scream and overwhelm us with its claims and promises.

Today I will look for one small sign that God is present in my daily life. I will give thanks for his presence. If he is absent, I will resolve to find out why.
