#### **Devotion from Linda Lindell**

In cleaning out some papers, I came across a copy of an old article from The Austin American Statesman newspaper from many years ago. It was written by Rev Browning Ware, who was pastor of the First Baptist Church in Austin at the time this article appeared.

#### "Acts of God's Grace Teach Patience, Appreciation"

Recently in the South, two old friends met for breakfast in a restaurant. One from the North ordered traditional ham 'n eggs. After being served, he pointed to his plate and asked "What's this?" "Grits," the waiter said. "But I didn't order grits!" "Sir," the waiter replied, "You don't order grits. Grits just comes."

Laughing over the incident, a group of my friends decided that theology may be simpler than it seems. People don't order grace. Grace just comes. Although God's grace can't be ordered, we are not beyond trying to help it come. Some people hope to manipulate grace by promises of what they will do or not do, if God will save their bacon just one more time. Attempting to seduce God may backfire. If what we desire isn't provided, we decide that God just doesn't care. Or, if He cares, that He isn't powerful enough to answer our request. On the other hand, if our desires are met, we may be seduced into thinking that we maneuvered grace. God's silence is the most respectful answer to some of our requests. He waits so that we may learn how to wait on Him. While we want things to happen, He wants us to happen—for a person to emerge.

Grits on your plate and grit in your life. Well, those things happen. However, look closely. You don't order grace. Grace just comes.


### **OUR WONDERFUL GEORGETOWN EMMAUS COMMUNITY LEADERSHIP**
