Do you have an attitude of gratitude? I've always tried to have one, thanking God for family and friends, my church, my home, even my dog. But one day it dawned on me that it had been awhile since I thanked Him for healing me from clinical depression. I had suffered bouts of this terrible illness since I was 29 years old. Last year I realized that it had been over a year since I had experienced an episode. I decided to stop taking the antidepressants. Now this was not a hasty decision; I prayed about it before quitting, because I had stopped them once before, and the depression returned with a vengeance. This time, however, there were no ill effects. At first, I thanked God often for healing me from this terrible sickness — that's what it is — a sickness, like diabetes, not something you can just snap out of. However, lately I have been taking this healing for granted. The Holy Spirit has prompted me to continue to thank and praise God for His mercy, along with so many other blessings He has given me.


