Dear Community, as you have briefly heard in the past, Emmaus is producing a new model of doing Emmaus with older adults where you do not go off for a retreat weekend but rather meet 8 times over 4 weeks with 2 3-hour sessions each week. It is with much sadness that we lost one of our most vibrant members in August, Polly Nelon, to a rare and fatal neurological disease. Jubilee Prison Ministry

I am Regional Director of Jubilee Prison Ministry in the Central Texas Region. We sponsor three units in Central Texas. Travis State Prison in Austin, Dominquez unit in San Antonio and the Havins unit in Brownwood Texas. The Lord has set a goal for our ministry to expand to four additional units by end of 2020. We are working on two Women's units in Gatesville and two Men's units in the San Antonio area. We may add a youth unit ministry God willing.

I would like to share testimonies from the Havins Unit in Brownwood at the August weekend. We knew two Satan worshipers would be attending. We were delighted to see they both prayed to Jesus Christ three times each during the weekend. We did not know that two members of the Arian brotherhood were among the 42 inmates, both of whom gave their lives to Christ. One testified at open mic on Sunday that he had learned that God is color blind and that he now has four brothers of color that he deeply loves and praised God for opening his heart. The second testified that his intention when he got out in twenty-one days was to beat his new son in law almost to death, not kill him as that would be a life sentence, just a near death beating, Why? The son in law is black, married to his white daughter they now have twin girls of mixed race, he has a new plan after meeting Jesus, to go and love his new granddaughters.

Let me share a little about Jubilee Prison Ministry. Being fellow Emmaus members most of you are familiar with Kairos. I served three years with Kairos at Bartlett and Luther units. Praise the Lord for Kairos and all they do. Jubilee was started by four men in the Woodlands that had been doing Kairos for thirty years. They discovered many prisons in the Greater Houston area that were not being served by Kairos. The reason was the short-term nature of these prisons as transfer units with a max stay of

two years or treatment facilities. The Lord placed a burden on these four men to find a way to serve these units. They discussed their plans with Kairos, which lead them to start a ministry for these units that are outside the scope of Kairos. Jubilee does not go into or compete with Kairos units in anyway. Jubilee is a 4th day program much like Kairos with weekly prayer and share events at the units, God gets done what he wants done every weekend with the same amazing results you have seen at Kairos weekends.

The next Jubilee weekend is at Travis State Prison, it will take place October 23-25. The goal is to have two Jubilee weekends a year at each unit. Local Jubilee Volunteers attend a 2-hour time of prayer at Travis State every Friday evening with inmates that have attended a previous weekend.

With the goals the Lord has for Jubilee our present thirty volunteers needs to grow to eighty of both men and women. Please prayerfully consider joining us, praying for Jubilee or contributing financially to this ministry.

FACE-TO-FACE Face-to-Face is an adaptation of the Walk to Emmaus for Older Adults (age 60+)

Rev. Mary Powell will be presenting at the October Gathering a brief introduction to the Face-to-Face program being offered by Upper Room and Central Texas Emmaus. There is an organizational team looking at the possibility of offering this program in Georgetown. But they are in need of leadership and support team members who are passionate about our Emmaus experience and our Older Adults.

The program includes 14 talks given by clergy and lay persons including 4 video meditations based on Bishop Job's book *Living Fully, Dying Well*, followed by table discussions, worship and Holy Communion. The Emmaus Community provides overall coordination and recruits and trains speakers. The hosting organization provides meeting facilities and a Logistics Leader who recruits and registers participants (if not handled by the community registrar), coordinates facilities setup and take down and refreshments and meals if team decides to have one at the end of the event. We have available facilities at the Wesleyan Home for Independent Living to hold the event.

Cost for doing Face-to-Face is much less than regular walk as 1) it is in Georgetown 2) no one goes somewhere but their own bed at night 3) team and pilgrims who live at the Wesleyan or nearby can eat their usual meals 4) cost for pilgrims is \$40 - \$80 and team is \$25, reflecting a much lower budget needed. A closing meal may be held as the team chooses to plan one.

Team meeting sites and cost are to be determined but team is smaller as there are only table leaders (no assistants), music team, and 14 talks (2 given by Lay Leader). Team will be Lay Director, Spiritual Director plus 4 other clergy, 2 coaches, logistics leader and their assistants, music leader or two, agape leader with 4 assistants, prayer team leader plus 3, media leader. Some talks have a different format based on the books *Coping in Tough Times* about hospice and grief and *Living Fully, Dying Well* by Job with 4 video meditations. Sponsors are not necessary. Some talks are shorter. 2 men's tables and 4 women's tables are the usual. Face-to-Face may be held from 9-12 am on several days in a row over 1 or over 2 weeks or extended up 8 weeks.

Similar programs held at the Wesleyan for Independent Living this summer have been well received with full participation. The personnel at the Wesleyan are accommodating and supporting this program if we have leadership to make it happen. Now is the time to do Face-to-Face while the residents (and others from the community) are open to additional programming. Late April of 2020 is probably the earliest it can be done following the guidelines for Face-to-Face.
